Inspiration:

Those of you who know my work already will be familiar with my "Prokofievian" take on music sometimes. I love how he would fool with our harmonic expectations, all the while using delightful rhythmic and orchestral textures. Today being April Fool's Day, I decided to allow that influence (especially the harmonic trickery) to flow into this etude; embracing it, rather than running from it.

Suggestions:

Start this one slowly (I think it still works at a slow tempo), and gradually work it up until you can play it in cut-time. During the *cantabile* section, imagine that the staccato eighth notes from the beginning are still existing beneath your long phrases. If I were to orchestrate this one, that contrapuntal material would indeed be happening somewhere else in the ensemble.
