

James M. Stephenson YEHTUDES – the story:

In the summer of 2018, I approached John Yeh, the assistant principal and solo E-flat clarinetist of the Chicago Symphony, about collaborating on a clarinet etude book. John and I had just finished a CD project with Cedille Records ("Liquid Melancholy"), which contained a lot of my solo and chamber clarinet music, yet I still felt inspired to create more music for clarinet. Furthermore, John's daughter, Molly, had recently been making big headlines as a food-blogger (resulting in a subsequent TV show), and upon a visit to her blog ("My Name is Yeh"), I discovered a list of cake recipes that I found to be musically inspiring. And with that, the idea for "Yehtudes" was born.

Following the example of a previous project I had done with trumpet players, John and I together sent out a notice to any interested clarinetists to see if they might like to "subscribe" to the project. To the right is a list of all of the brave clarinetists who signed on, and who agree to receive "world premiere Yehtude m the email inboxes, for their own firsthand lo each one, just created that day I attempted to address (with John . hele) different points of study for the clari et, but to do so in a way that would simult neously be musically rewar ing. from composer, in stephenson:

This "Yehtude" is created as an effort to focus of those commonly known breaks that exist for the clarinet player. Rather than to continually compose notes the deal with these well-known notes/intervals, I decided instead to try to create something that is (h.pefully) must cally rewarding, where the player's primary goal is to focus on music, and to over one technical issues in order to achieve their artistic vision. This is what would most class occur in the repertoire, and it was my goal to emulate that idea. Tempos should be used only as a guideline. Each player may choose to go slower or faster, per their particular needs.

I thought M ray's " gboy utle would coordinate best with an etude dealing with "breaks".

I hope you enjoy a sense of humor with all of that, and that it makes you feel "sunny side up", as John put it.
